# St Peter's Church Wolvercote Oxford

# Survey of Monuments 1983-84

Recorded by Mrs Teresa Lisemore, Mrs Isobel May, Miss Virginia Royds and Miss Alma Woods (members of Wolvercote Women's Institute)

In making this record, use was made of a list of inscriptions dated September 11, 1882, drawn up by Mr William Plowman. A number of the earlier inscriptions which he recorded were partly or wholly illegible by 1983 (and were considerably worse in 2020). Those which were recorded in 1882, but could not be found in 1983, are recorded in the Appendix.

Information from the *Parish Registers* has been added where it differs from or supplements the information given on the memorials.

The survey was digitized in 2020 and the opportunity was taken to update the plan on page 60 to take account of stones moved at the time of the Development Project in 2011.

All or most of the line of headstones along the western boundary railing of the churchyard were in their present positions in 1882 (Nos. 1 to 16).

What are now the main gates of the churchyard, with a paved path leading to the south porch of the Church, were finished in July 1938, the work having been done voluntarily by Church members. A few headstones had to be moved but no record remains of which these were.

The present vestries for the choir and clergy were added to the Church in 1935, and three monuments which were previously in the churchyard were incorporated in them. (see page 49)

Burials "in woollen" were recorded in the *Parish Register* between 5 December 1678 and 5 March 1780 (see X.11).

It should be borne in mind that in 1752 the Gregorian Calendar was adopted, with the loss of 11 days (3 September becoming 4 September), and in the same year the beginning of the year was changed from 25 March to 1 January.

For easy reference, the Churchyard was divided into four sections marked A, B, C, and (see Plan at end), but the numbering is consecutive from the first to the last of the monuments in the Churchyard. The monuments in the Church are marked X, with their own numbering.

The Church of the C.14/C.15 was pulled down, except for the tower, in 1859 and the rebuilding was completed in 1860.

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East, West, etc = direction in which the inscription faces. Dimensions given = width of the stone, unless otherwise stated. For sections A, B, C, and D, see plan at the end (Plate IV)



From these several sums making in all the sum of £225 certain lands in this parish consisting of eight acres and one acre more making in all nine acres commonly called Poors Plot were purchased by trustees Oct 1706 and the yearly produce is applied to the benefit of poor of this parish.

The sum of 101£ was accordingly purchased in the 3 per cent Consols with the said sum of 90£ in the same Aug 1830.

David Walter died in 1679 (see X.11), so if the benefactions are listed in chronological order, the Richard Hall mentioned could be one of several: One is recorded in the *Parish Register* as having been buried in 1681: two died in 1696 (see X.38) and the burial of a fourth is recorded in the *Parish Register* on November 3 1704.

He / was borne att Sarseden in this County. / Marryed Elizabeth ye widow of Frances (*sic*) / Lord Dacre of Herstmonceux in Sussex / by who he had no issue. Dyed att / London ye 22 of Aprill 1679 / and in the 68 yeare of his age.

Parish Register: "April 20 1679 – David Walter, Esq, Lord of Godstow, buryed but not according to the Act of Parliament. Whereupon information being given to a Justice of the Peace, the executor, I, Will Walter, ordered 50 shillings to be paid to the poor of this parish, the other 50 shillings being due to the informer." The date of "22 Aprill" is quite clear on the tablet, but the use of 'th' suggests that this might possibly be a mistake for "12th". Burials "in the woollen" are recorded in the Parish Register from December, 1678, after which date an affidavit had to be sworn that the body had been buried in woollen. It was this law which had not been obeyed in the case of David Walter's burial.

X.16 Large rectangular chest tomb in a bay off the east end of the North Aisle. On the top of the tomb are the recumbent figures of Sir John Walter and his two wives, one on each side of him. Alongside their heads and their feet, also on top of the tomb, are two rows of kneeling figures – three sons on the east side and three daughters on the west side. On the front (or south side) of the tomb there is the following inscription in two central panels:

#### **ENGLISH TRANSLATION**

Sacred to the memory of Sir John Walter, second son of Edmund Walter, formerly one of the two Welsh Judges; when young he was brought up at Brasenose College, Oxford, when older at the Inner Temple, London, where treading in his father's footsteps, he was so distinguished by his study of the Municipal Law of this Kingdom, that in a short time he was every where spoken of as its honour and delight. He was Attorney General to King Charles the First, afterwards Sergeant at Law, and at last he was made by the same King

Chief Baron of the Exchequer, all of which duties he performed with Integrity and Knowledge, and exercised with Judgement and Ability. He left £1000 to Jesus College, Oxford, and £100 to the churches of Sarsden and Churchill in the county of Oxford which were annually to be divided between them. He also left sums of money to seven parishes for the use of the Poor which were to remain for ever; he was truly a singularly rare example, because he made his own Family partaker of his substance and the church his Co-heir. Thus was he a man devoted to his College for the sake of the Church, and to the Church for the sake of God; at last full of days and honours he yielded himself at the same time to the will of God and the law of nature.

He married Margaret daughter of Wm Offley Esquire of London, by whom he had eight children, of each Sex and equal number, William, Edward, David, and John; Mary, Elizabeth, Katharine, and Margaret. His wife was deeply lamented for her tender love for her children and husband. For his second wife he married Lady Anne Bigges widow of Sir Thomas Bigges of Lenchwick, Worcestershire, Knight and Baronet, who was the daughter of William Wytham Esq, of Ledston in the County of York; to say no more, she was a wife truly pious and devoted to her husband. He himself (while he was alive) acquired this monument. After his death his wife, in deepest sorrow, caused it to be erected; after he was buried, Jesus College, Oxford, caused it to be inscribed.


He died November 18, the year of our Lord 1630, aged 67 *Parish Register*: 1630 December 7, John Walter, Lord of Godstow, buried Lady Anne Walter, wife to Sir John Walter, Lord Chief Baron, was buried on April 13, 1636. No reference to the burial of his first wife Margaret, née Offley, has been traced.

Anthony Wood records the following notes about this monument:

- (1) Dated April 30 1657: "At the head 4 sons kneeling and at the foot 4 daughters". He adds that the monument was "miserably defaced at the time of the Civil War when Oxford was besieged".
- (2) Undated slip inserted into one of the manuscripts (might be as late as 1681): "Three daughters kneeling at the head, three sons at the feet".
- (3) "He (David Walter) bequeathed 300 li with which was repaired this monument miserably shattered and defaced in the time of the civil war. Repaired 1681". (David Walter died in 1679). Either the 1657 note is incorrect, or the respective positions of the sons and daughters were changed round in 1681. Further damage was done in the nineteenth century when the Church was rebuilt and the north side of the tomb was embedded in the north wall of the bay. Some colour still remains on the figures.

There was a canopy over the tomb, and Note 2 by Anthony Wood quoted above records "The pillars that uphold the canopy are black and white". This is evidence that the canopy was there after the Civil War, but it has not been possible to find any evidence of when it was destroyed. There is a water colour in the Church of unknown date by an unknown artist which shows the tomb covered by a canopy with two barrel-vaulted ceilings running north and south, five pillars and a pediment with three shields on the top. The remains of the Corinthian capital of one of the pillars still survives, together with the shields, which are now on the wall of the North Aisle above the tomb. For a description of the shields, see next page.

This Richard Hall, senior, might have been the father of the first of the two Richard Halls who died in 1696 and the fact that he predeceased him would explain why only the grandfather is mentioned on the stone. The following entry in the Parish Register refers to this grandson: baptised on May 6, 1667, Richard on of Richard Hall. The Parish Register also records the burial on 3 November 1704 of Richard Hall, who might have been the grandfather. See X31.

His father is buried in the Chancell of Wolvercote Church and so is a younger brother of his, viz Thomas Beckford, who died of the Gout some years since, in the 44th Year of his Age."

Sacred to the memory of JOHN BULL of the City of Oxford Esquire/Member of the Royal College of Surgeons, London/who died 10 Oct 1834, aged 73 and, by his own desire/was buried here in the grave of his Father and of his Mother. /

Left an orphan at an early age, he trusted to himself/ under Providence, for reputation and an honest independence. / Eager in the pursuit of professional knowledge/sagacious and prudent in its application,/ he practised medicine with unwearied industry and . distinguished success for the long space of 45 years./ He was a man of simple tastes and kindly feelings,/ resolute, yet unpresuming, courteous, yet sincere,/he combined with self-respect, considerateness towards others./ The world esteemed him for his integrity,/ his family loved and revered him for his tender indulgence,/ and generous self-devotion to their happiness and advancement./ During his latter years/ he bore the loss of sight with cheerful and pious resignation,/ and at length in the same spirit gave up his soul to God/leaving to his wife and children/ the dearest recollections of their conversation here,/ and the humble hope, thro' Christ, of their reunion hereafter. In memory of Lieut. WILLIAM HOWELL BALL, who entered/ the Army as a Private in the Scots Fusileer Guards in 1794. / Was advanced to the rank of Sergeant-Major. Afterwards/ appointed Ensign and Adjutant in the 2<sup>nd</sup> battalion 93<sup>rd</sup>/ Royal Highlanders, which regiment he assisted to raise/ and for his exertions was made Lieutenant. / He subsequently joined the Royal Veterans and died Jan 5 1860 aged 87 years./ Also of MARY his wife, who died Sept 17 1855, aged 82 years.

Parish Register says that Mary Ball was aged 81 at the time of her burial.

## **Churchyard**

App1

Said in the 1882 list to be "West of the Tower", and may have been moved when the memorial to the 1914-1918 War was put up. In memory of CHARLOTTE wife of / JAMES TREDWELL who died/April 1829. Aged 52 years/ Verse mentions lingering sickness. *Parish Register* spells the name "Treadwell", and gives the age at the time of burial as 51.

App2

Said in the 1882 list to be "close" to the stone to Joseph Shaw (See A45). It may have been moved when the new front gate and path to the south porch were put in in 1938. In memory of / JAMES OSBORN / who died November 300 / aged 82 years / 176\_

Parish Register gives the date of burial as December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1768

App3

Said in the 1882 list to be "to left" of App2, which see re possibility of having been moved.

In memory of / JOHN HICKS / who die June 20 1821 / aged 52 years.

Also SARAH his wife / who died April 18 1848 / aged 73 years

Also THOS. Their son / who died May 29. 1804 / aged 4 years

Parish Register records that in 1799 John Hicks of this parish married Sarah Hunt of St Giles, Oxford.

App4

Said in the 1882 list to be at the foot of the monument to William Howell (see D196) on a "flat stone".

Sacred to the memory of JEREMIAH BISHOP/ who died May 28. 1822, aged 38 years.

Parish Register records the burial of Jeremiah Bishop of Godstow on 30 May 1822, aged 39

[ Note on App 4 to App9. Apart from D203, the area where these memorials must have been is now empty. D200 was also originally in this area.]

App5

Said in the 1882 list to be "at foot to east" in relation to D197. Sacred to the memory of / ELIZABETH widow of JEREMIAH BISHOP/ and wife of /THOMAS ROWLAND/ who died Sept 24 1832/ aged 51. Also of / ELIZABETH EVINS/ their niece / who died Nov 3. 1832 / aged 12 years.

Parish Register says that Elizabeth Rowland was "Of Godstow". It also records that the niece, whose surname is spelt "Evans", was 11 at the time of her burial, and describes her as being "of Godstow".

App6 Said in the 1882 list to be "Right" of App5 In memory of / JAMES BISHOP/ of Godstow / who died Sep 17. 1817/ aged 87 years

App7 Said in the 1882 list to be "east of above", which refers to the original position of the stone to Ruth Bishop (see D200), which in turn was described as being "to right" of App6.

App8 Said in 1882 list to be "to right" of App7.
In memory of /THOMAS SEAL/ who died Dec 29. 1789/ aged 84 years

App9 Sai in the 1882 list to be "close" to App8.
Sacred to the memory of / THOMAS Seal / who died Oct 27. 1809

Parish Register spell the name "Seale".

App 10 Follows on after A52 in the 1882 list, i.e. was somewhere to the north of the church
In memory of / JOS WEST. Officer / of Excise, a native/
of Hertfordshire/ he died July ye 22 / 1810 aged 31
Parish Register spells the name "Went".

App 11 Said in the 1882 list to be "on cross to left" of A40.

In memory of / MARY ANN CHURCHILL / who died June 21. 1875 / Aged 12 years 10 months / verse

App 12 Said in the 1882 list as being "on a flat stone close to the east wall of the new part" and next to C179 which was "on its right".

JOHN HENRY/ STACEY/ entered into rest/ Dec 18. 1883 aged 77.

App13 Described in the 1882 list as being "on a flat stone close to the east wall of new part" and next to C179 which was "on its right".

In memory of / LODER PRICKETT / who died Mar 8. 1861 / aged 61 Also of SARAH PRICKETT who died / March 21. 1877 aged 77.

App14 Said in the 1882 list to be "near" C178.

Now C156 Sacred to the memory of / THOMAS WOODWARD / who departed this life / Nov 23 1858 / aged 43 / Also of HARRIETT his wife / Who departed this life / May 23. 1884 / aged 67 / verse Parish Register spells "Harriet" with only one "t".

Recorded in 1882 as: "Flat stone, middle aisle, near chancel arch".

Probably now covered by the platform built for the Nave altar in 1974.

In memory of / GEORGE SMITH / who died Oct 20 1724 / aged 55

Years. / Also of ANN his wife / who died Aug 7. 1761 / aged 87 years.

/ And of their two sons / GEORGE died Nov 9 1749 / aged 41 years /

JAMES died Dec 2. 1758 / aged 43 years. /

Likewise in memory of / JOHN BULL / who died Nov 24. 1763 / aged

37 years / and of AVIS his wife / daughter of the above /

GEORGE and ANN SMITH / who died Oct 29 1785 / aged 67 years. /

Esq, / only child of the above JOHN and AVIS BULL / who died

Parish Register gives the Christian name of James Smith as John, buried December 7, 1758. The Register also records the marriage of Henry Tredwell and Avis Bull, widow, on February 3. 1765. For John and Martha Bull, see also X55 and X57. Parish Register says that Martha Bull was "of St Michael's, Oxford", and gives the Christian name of the daughter as Mary Martha.
